

The charity Justice Reflections has completed another successful year in terms of its continuing publications, but like many small concerns, is facing funding challenges.

Issues 25, 26 and 27 completed the ninth series, as usual all containing essays from around the world relating justice to theological matters

We continue to supply prison ministry workers in developing nations free of charge and, as in past years, this accounts for almost a third of our mailing list. With a budget of around £8,000, rising printing and postage costs have depleted our reserves, and we need increased donations and more subscribers to help us balance our books. We are pursuing ways of recruiting more supporters in this coming year. Our visit to the International Prison Chaplains' Association Conference in Sweden helped us to keep Justice Reflections and its work in front of a bigger audience.
